


# OUR APPROACH

1-day Sustainability training with a focus on diversity and inclusion for SWIRE Properties, using the University of Hong Kong campus as a SDG model.






Inclusive classroom training with case studies and role-play for King George V School targetted at student and teacher diversity ambassadors

The UN has identified eight key overarching competencies for thinking, anticipatory, normative, sustainability: systems strategic, collaboration, critical thinking, self-awareness, and integrated problemsolving competencies. These skills both enable students to better understand what SDGs are about and provide tools to contribute to the sustainability transformation. All workshops in Encompass HK training programmes include a combination of SDGs competencies and experientiallearning element. We understand that each client has their unique approach in learning. ## WHY TEACH SDGS IN SCHOOL?

Traditional education gives students few opportunities to explore, understand, and solve real-world problems. So how are students expected to prepare for all these complex local and global issues? Teaching about the SDGs is an excellent way of addressing controversial and complex local, national and international issues.

The SDGs can be used as a framework and tool to support students develop their research, critical thinking, problem-solving, systems thinking, selfawareness, and communication skills. Students need these 21st-century skills to be better equipped to take action and make a change. Teaching and exploring SDGs can also support students in finding their identity and purpose.

Teaching SDGs promotes creative and innovative practices in school curricula and pedagogy through project-based learning approaches and other engaging education tools. Teaching SDGs bridges subject divides – it is not simply an interdisciplinary theme, but a topic that requires us all to wear different hats and to appreciate those that wear other hats more comfortably than we do.

Educators can nurture students' curiosity and provide them with resources to inquire, understand, engage and communicate the importance of sustainability. This understanding empowers individual and collective action at the local, national and international levels. Teaching SDGs has an incredible potential to be the driver of the change the world needs to achieve every single sustainable development goals.

### **SDG TEACHER TRAINING**

The Sustainable Development Goals — also known as the SDGs or the Global Goals — were launched by the United Nations in 2015 and cover a wide range of sustainability issues; highlighting local, national and international priority areas to end poverty and hunger, improve health and education, make cities more sustainable and combat climate change.

As sustainability becomes ever more important, this workshop aims to equip educators with knowledge and tools to integrate Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in their teaching approaches. ESD can help to address the interconnected global challenges we are facing and prepare students to find solutions.

During this workshop, we will situate the key understandings related to each goal as a way to inform and provoke discussions among students and teachers in and out of the classroom. No matter the teaching background or their specialized subjects, this workshop will provide teachers with meaningful curriculum connections that can be found in the SDGs and encourage them to integrate the SDGs in their classrooms in creative and innovative ways.

#### **SESSION 2**

Wicked Problem	15 min	Introduction to wicked problems where there is no single solution to the problem.
		Participants will be asked to name the biggest problems faced by people in their community. Then, they will be asked to imagine they have been given the power to change things and discuss how the SDGs might be able to solve this.
Key competencies for learning SDGs	15 min	Competencies describe the specific attributes individuals need for action and self-organization in various complex contexts and situations. They are acquired during action, on the basis of experience and reflection. • Systems thinking competency • Anticipatory competency • Normative competency • Strategic competency • Collaboration competency • Critical thinking competency • Self-awareness competency • Integrated problem-solving competency
Curriculum mapping	30 min	Individually, participants will be invited look closely at your existing curricula syllabi and school activities to identify where themes and issues of ESD are already included. Then, participants will be asked to identify potential areas of the existing curriculum in which to insert and develop examples that illustrate sustainability. In a group, using stickie notes participants will create their school's ESD map displaying current good practices and opportunities for improvement.
